**RE: Awards Presented**

Sheriff Wayne Rausch is proud to announce that on Monday May 7, 2012 Lt. Brannon Jordan and Chief Deputy Brian Strampher were presented Trilogy Awards by the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Association (FBI-LEEDA). The awards were presented during the opening ceremony of the Association's Annual Training Conference.

The Mission of FBI-LEEDA is to advance the science and art of police leadership and management, develop and disseminate improved administrative and technical practices to meet the needs of law enforcement executives globally, promote the exchange of information and expansion of training programs for executives enforcement executives and pursue educational excellence through continued public and private partnership programs.

Association members become eligible to receive the Trilogy Award by successfully completing the the Command Institute, Supervisor Leadership Institute and the Executive Survival: Policing in the 21st Century training courses, which total just over 100 hours of training. Trilogy Awards have only been awarded for four years and only about sixty (60) have been awarded nationwide.

The Command Institute for Law Enforcement Executives is a dynamic, intensive and challenging program specifically and uniquely designed to prepare law enforcement leaders for command level positions.

The Supervisor Leadership Institute is a cutting edge program built especially for first-line supervisors and middle managers with the goal of enhancing leadership competencies. Attendees engage in personality diagnostics, leadership case studies, mentoring, developing people, performance management, risk management and leadership legacy.

The FBI-LEEDA Executive Survival: Policing in the 21st Century is an innovative program designed for senior law enforcement executives focusing on the emerging challenges facing our profession. The course looks to identify the forces of change and emerging trends within the law enforcement community, such as the challenges of merging the perspectives of Traditionalist, Baby Boom, Generation X and Millennial employees and presents leadership strategies to manage and adapt to the future conditions. The program also looks into the future to forecast several emerging global "Megatrends" that are expected to shape conditions for the next few decades and discuss how those trends will affect the global law enforcement community and how police executives can influence and shape future conditions.

Members of the FBI Law Enforcement Executive Development Association consist mostly of decision-makers from local, state and federal law enforcement agencies from throughout the United States and numerous foreign countries.

The requirements for active membership in FBI - LEEDA is to have participated in a Command Institute for Law Enforcement Executives, LEEDS training at the FBI Academy or a regional FBI Command College. Jordan and Strampher are both graduates of the FBI Intermountain Command College.

In addition to FBI – LEEDA's mission of leadership and management training excellence, the Association strives to provide information to its members which will enhance their ability to maintain an outstanding quality of life in the communities in which they serve.

The Sheriff's Office has benefited greatly from the training and experience Lt. Jordan and Chief Deputy Strampher have obtained through their membership and training from the Association. While attending the annual Conference they will receive even further training, which includes topics covering social media, leadership, domestic terrorism and information sharing.
